Thames Marine Mammal Sightings Survey

ZSL launched the Thames Marine Mammal Sightings Survey in July 2004.

Any member of the public who sees dolphins, porpoises and seals in the Thames can participate in the survey.

So far, we've had over 160 sightings sent in - including harbour porpoises by Tower Bridge and common seals at Wapping!

The map below shows locations of sighting we have received so far...

Marine mammals are known to visit the Thames estuary but until now sightings have not been formally recorded. Our survey is ongoing and addresses this information gap. Data collected will determine patterns in species distribution, behaviour and habitat use.

Findings will also be fed into national databases. Our survey is operating in the tidal Thames area, from Teddington down to Shoeburyness and Sheerness in the outer estuary.
